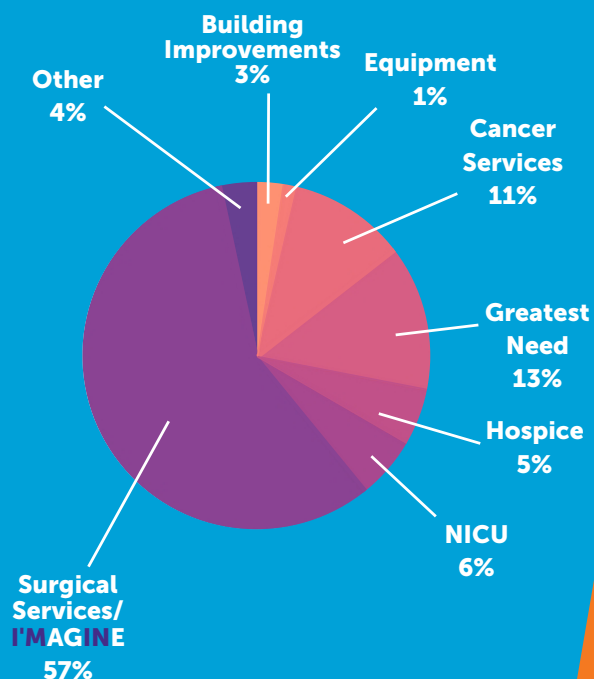


The VitalBeam Linear Accelerator, which performs precisely targeted radiation in fewer high-dose treatments, was funded by philanthropic dollars.
