Why is immunizing important?

Vaccinating children and adolescents may be the single most important health-promoting form of prevention we can perform as parents and caregivers. Vaccines are safe and effective at preventing serious illness and saving lives. Children who are not able to be vaccinated for medical reasons need their schoolmates and playmates to be immunized to help protect them against preventable diseases.

Do you have a medical question? Our telephone advice nurses are available to help 24/7.

Whether your baby won't stop crying during the middle of the night or they're running a fever and you wonder if you need to seek medical attention, our telephone advice nurses are on standby to assist you. They will clarify your information, assess any symptoms, provide advice based on medical protocol and coordinate with your doctor to help determine the medical care needed.
